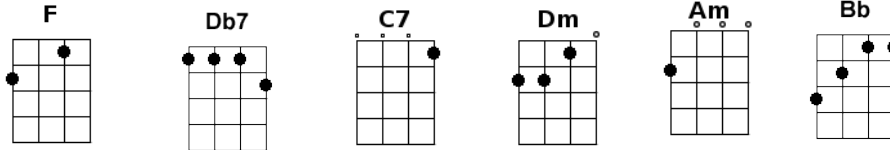


Ukulele Lady: Richard Whiting & Gus Kahn
